LEEK U3A - MEMBERSHIP SUBSCRIPTION - REMINDER

This is a reminder of the situation regarding Cheadle members attending Leek U3A activities. We were informed by the Committee of Leek U3A in October 2015 that they are discontinuing the reciprocal agreement for membership subscriptions that they have with their neighbouring U3As. This meant that from 2016 any member of Cheadle U3A who takes part in a Leek U3A activity will be required to pay the Leek U3A annual membership subscription. The Leek U3A subscription for 2016 is £15 but a reduced fee will be charged to members from other U3As, because Leek will not charge them the National Third Age capitation fee, (this has already been paid through their "Home" U3A subscription and is approx. £5).

We (the Committee of Cheadle U3A) regret this decision by Leek U3a but we have voted unanimously not to impose a reciprocal requirement for Leek U3A members to pay our annual subscription. This is because the majority of the Cheadle £10 membership subscription goes towards the payment of a member's Third Age Trust capitation fee and the twice yearly Cheadle U3A newsletters. Members of other U3As have the capitation paid by their own U3A and they do not receive our Cheadle newsletter. They do however contribute to our finances through payment of the £1 group fee.

However, Cheadle U3A members will always have priority over members of other U3As when it comes to allocation of places in Cheadle U3A activity groups. If a group has a waiting list of members from both Cheadle and other U3As the Cheadle members will be allocated places first. If a group is full and has existing members from another U3A in the group who have not paid the Cheadle membership subscription then they will be asked to leave the group to make a space if a Cheadle member wishes to join.
