VERSE AND WORSE POETRY GROUP - Alan & Barbara Lewis - (Webpage)

The Verse and Worse Poetry Group currently has a few vacancies so if you are interested please ring Alan or Barbara on 754208. A little about the group. We are now in our 15th year as a Group in Cheadle U3A. Over all this time the format has changed very little. Our meetings are very informal and do not demand any poetry writing skills although a few of our members do have this ability and from time to time give us a reading. Each month we choose either a poet or a theme and members come to the meeting with a poem which they have researched either from books or from the internet which nowadays, of course has a wealth of material. At the meeting each poem is read (generally by the person who has brought it along but again this is not compulsory and a member is quite at liberty to ask another member to read it for them should they wish). Some of the poems engender discussion after the reading and in addition members often say a little about the poem or poet before reading it. This format is used in most of our meetings but occasionally a member will give a talk and occasionally we are entertained by a visiting poet. We are a very democratic and friendly group and the leaders try to avoid being prescriptive (if they tried they would never get away with it anyway apart from the fact that their own knowledge of poetry is insufficient to want or to do so). You are very welcome to attend one of our meetings without any initial commitment. If it proves not to be for you then fair enough. We meet on the fourth Tuesday of the month in the Oakley Room starting at 10:30 am and finishing at 12 o'clock. Our next meeting is on Tuesday October 24th.

The Roman Empire

On the 18th October we will be looking at the all conquering growth of the Roman Empire across Europe and North Africa. The Romans initially copied Greek architecture but then developed its form and function with their invention of concrete. This material allowed far more sophisticated buildings to be built including The Pantheon which two thousand years later is still the largest unsupported concrete dome in the world. We will look at the Romans at home and how they provided ample running water supplies to their towns, so much that they could exhibit fountains in the streets of Rome, when the rest of the world struggled to obtain any drinking water. Men conquered in warfare were taken back to Rome to serve as slaves or gladiators. The arrival of an imposing man on the scene brought about a massive conversion which influenced architecture in later times and we will look at those changes next month.

MUSIC ENJOYMENT GROUP - Alan Lewis - (Webpage)

The past two weeks have seen us enjoy DVDs of two brilliant and contrasting performances. Most of the two sessions were taken up by the superb Cameron Mackintosh 25th Anniversary celebration of The Phantom of the Opera with some wonderful singing and orchestral playing together with modern technology giving us some brilliant visual effects. The second half of week two was taken up by an unusual, amusing and comprehensive analysis of one the most innovative and greatest revolutionary works ever composed, Beethoven's Eroica. Almost impossible to believe that this wonderful work was written well over 200 years ago by a colossal genius who had risen from the depths of despair following his increasing deafness and near suicide. It sounds just as fresh today

and had a profound effect on compositions of composers all the way through to the 20th century. What made this DVD extra special was that it was taken from this year's proms and following the analysis, the whole work, lasting almost 45 minutes was played by the Aurelia Symphony orchestra completely from memory with some superb virtuosity particularly from the woodwind players. Beethoven was of course noted for his innovative use of this section of the symphony orchestra.

Just thought I'd let you know about one or two future delights. The next two weeks we will be watching (Oct 9th and 16th) a new performance of Mozart's brilliant Marriage of Figaro. Other items which will be in the pipeline in the near future will include a concert performance of Oklahoma from this year's proms. This features the John Wilson Orchestra in which local star Mike Lovatt (son of Ken Lovatt) is head of the trumpet section. Not to be missed. There will also be a performance of Puccini's La Boheme and a DVD of two colossal works by Rachmaninov. His brilliant 3rd piano concerto, a very difficult work to play and one of the "Everests" of the genre, together with his second symphony.
