HISTORY OF ARCHITECTURE (Webpage) (Gallery)

We meet again on September 19th to look at the Tudor style, which includes Elizabethan. The climax of the medieval period and the start of English Renaissance. Henry VIII closed the monasteries when he fell out with the Pope and acquired their wealth as his Treasury was broke. He then distributed the monastic land to his favourites and so begun a massive rebuilding programme of fine houses for the rich. It also happened to be a socially settled time, following the terrible Wars of the Roses and consequently houses, colleges, and civil buildings were built due to the growing wealth of the country. Elizabeth ruled for many years which added to the stability and England grew as a world power which all contributed to the wealth of the country and the appearance of many fine buildings to talk about. We begin to see the growth of two classes of domestic buildings, the ostentatious mansions of Elizabeth's courtiers, and the simpler timber framed buildings of the ordinary folk. Beryl and I visited Speke House today and heard the story of the building of this fine Tudor house from a genuine Tudor lady, I have her photograph if you do not believe me.

I also have some splendid videos to share with you so I hope you can spare the time to learn about the Tudors.
